Dear People of St. Andrew,

On October 12th, St. Andrew celebrates its 130th anniversary as a congregation. The occasion of such an anniversary becomes an opportunity to tell stories of the congregation's history, many of which are not regularly told. Did you know?

- St. Andrew's Evangelical Lutheran Church was founded with the aim to be the first English Lutheran Church of the Missouri Synod in the downtown section of Pittsburgh
- The congregation's first home was the Fifth Avenue Bank Hall at the corner of Fifth Ave and Stevenson St.
- The first parsonage, known as the "Round House" was obtained at 405 Fifth Ave. on September 10, 1891.
- St. Andrew's first church building was dedicated on October 23, 1892 at the corner of Stevenson and Colwell streets.
- In summer of 1897, St. Andrew opened a Sunday School ministry in Oakland.
- The cornerstone for the current church building was laid on September 8, 1901 and the church dedicated a year later, September 28, 1902.
- In December 1976, St. Andrew withdrew from the Missouri Synod to join the newly formed Association of Evangelical Lutheran Churches (AELC).
- In 1986, St. Andrew voted to become a part of the church that resulted from the merger of the AELC, American Lutheran Church, and Lutheran Church in America church, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA).
- St. John's Lutheran Church of 40th St. merged with St. Andrew in 2001.

There is, of course, so much to be thankful for in St. Andrew's rich history. We remember with thanksgiving the countless saints who have gone before us, who have touched our lives with their witness to God's love, whose work and ministry over generations have brought St. Andrew to this day. We celebrate the incalculable gifts of God's mercy and grace, which have led St. Andrew through two turns of a century, two world wars, two global pandemics, and an incredibly dynamic transformation of the city we call home. For 130 years, God has been our refuge, strength, a very present help for the people of St. Andrew, as individuals and as a community.

Just a few weeks after St. Andrew's anniversary, the church celebrates Reformation Day on October 31st, a day that reminds us that the we are still on a journey, always called to be open to the leading of God's Spirit, always reforming to become more and more the church that God would have us be to better love and serve our neighbors in our current time and context. While we are still discerning what the church will become, we need not fear. God is in the midst of the city, where St. Andrew has lived its faith for 130 years. We know and trust that God will continue to be our God, and that God's name will continue to be exalted, here and among the nations, through the leading of the Spirit, and the presence of Jesus Christ, our Savior.
