Being Good Stewards of our Church Grounds

Those of you who have been able to attend worship in person this fall may have noticed some changes in the appearance of our church grounds. In addition to weeding our flower beds, volunteers have been working on removing the invasive plants that have been gradually taking over the grounds. The worst offenders are porcelain berry vines and Amur honeysuckle shrubs. Both of these plants were introduced from Asia as ornamentals in the nineteenth century, but are now recognized as undesirable invasive plants. Birds eat their berries, which are the avian equivalent of junk food, and then deposit the seeds far and wide in their droppings. New plants readily sprout and quickly displace the native plants, doing serious harm to the ecosystem. Our goal is to finish removing the invasive plants this fall and begin replacing them with appropriate noninvasive plants next spring. Anyone who would like to help with these projects may contact Pastor Ross or Lester Prince.
