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+ Tenth Sunday after Pentecost Order for Worship

The Word of God is a refining fire. Jesus is the great divide in human history. He invites our undivided attention and devotion. Today in worship we are surrounded by a great "cloud of witnesses." In the Word and in Holy Communion we are invited yet again to look to Jesus, "the pioneer and perfecter of our faith."

The following safety precautions and protocols apply to everyone in the building, regardless of vaccination status.

- Covid-19 transmission rates in Allegheny County have returned to the "high" category, so face masks that fully cover both your mouth and nose are required for all parishioners over the age of two (2).
- Physical distancing of at least six (6) feet will be observed at all times for people not from your household.
- Hand sanitizer is available at the front of the sanctuary to use before Holy Communion, after you proceed past the baptismal font, as the alcohol has been affecting the finish on the font's bowl.

Worship Services are live streamed to multiple online platforms. By attending worship, you agree that your image and voice may be broadcast.






