- Worship Services are live-streamed to multiple online platforms. By attending worship, you agree that your image and voice may be broadcast.
- Everyone is invited to make a name tag at the black bookcase in the back of the worship space if they would like. There are stickers indicating pronouns on the bookcase if you would like to include them on your name tag.
- Children are invited to attend Little Church Big Faith, a Bible lesson and activity, during worship (after the Prayer of the Day). The group returns to the worship space for the liturgy of Holy Communion.
- A nursery is available through the doors at the left side of the sanctuary and across from the doorway to the Social Hall. Look for a purple-colored room.
- Worship "toolkits" to help children engage with the service, along with "busy bags" for younger children, are available in the bookcase at the back of the sanctuary. Please feel free to take one to use with/for your children.
- Holy Communion is served with bread (gluten-free available) and wine or grape juice. The
 presiding minister will distribute the bread (host). Please consume this and then pick up an empty
 glass from the tray. The Communion Assistant will pour wine or grape juice into your glass.
 Please step to the side to consume the wine or grape juice. Feel free to kneel at the altar for prayer
 and reflection. As you return to your pew, glasses may be returned to the empty trays on either
 side of the center section.
- A restroom is available on the main level of the church, through the doors to the Social Hall and to the right in the main office.

First Reading – Acts 16: 9-15

⁹ During the night Paul had a vision: there stood a man of Macedonia pleading with him and saying, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." ¹⁰ When he had seen the vision, we immediately tried to cross over to Macedonia, being convinced that God had called us to proclaim the good news to them.

¹¹ We therefore set sail from Troas and took a straight course to Samothrace, the following day to Neapolis, ¹² and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman colony. We remained in this city for some days. ¹³ On the Sabbath day we went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a place of prayer, and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there. ¹⁴ A certain woman named Lydia, a worshiper of God, was listening to us; she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple cloth. The Lord opened her heart to listen eagerly to what was said by Paul. ¹⁵ When she and her household were baptized, she urged us, saying, "If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come and stay at my home." And she prevailed upon us.



¹⁰ And in the spirit he carried me away to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God.

²² I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb. ²³ And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb. ²⁴ The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it. ²⁵ Its gates will never be shut by day—and there will be no night

there. ²⁶ People will bring into it the glory and the honor of the nations. ²⁷ But nothing unclean will enter it, nor anyone who practices abomination or falsehood, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life.

¹ Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb ² through the middle of the street of the city. On either side of the river is the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, producing its fruit each month, and the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations. ³ Nothing accursed will be found there any more. But the throne of God and of the Lamb will be in it, and his servants will worship him; ⁴ they will see his face, and his name will be on their foreheads. ⁵ And there will be no more night; they need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign forever and ever.



Nicene Creed


- All who seek God and desire a deeper and stronger life in Christ are welcome to receive Holy Communion.



- Farewell and Godspeed to Matthew and Emma! Emma and Matthew have been part of the St. Andrew community for the past several years, and they are moving on to a new home in Rhode Island, where Matthew has a new job and they will be close to his family. On such occasions we offer blessings of farewell and Godspeed during worship. Please pray for Matthew and Emma as they move on to serve God and neighbor in a new place!
- Little Church Big Faith Pausing for Summer Little Church Big Faith, St. Andrew's Bible lesson and activity for children that takes place during worship, will be taking a pause for the summer after class today. Please watch future communications for information on when we will resume in September!
- Represent St. Andrew at Pittsburgh Pride Saturday, May 31st, in Two Hour Blocks from 10:00 a.m. 2:00 p.m. St. Andrew is a Reconciling in Christ (RIC) congregation, publicly supporting the full welcome, participation, and affirmation of LGBTQIA+ siblings in church and society. As a part of this ministry, we participate in Pittsburgh Pride each year with other RIC congregations in the area. This year's booth will be at the Pride festival on the North Side on Saturday, May 31st. We are asking people to represent the church greeting people, sharing conversation and information about the church, and connecting people to resources in two-hour increments from 10:00 a.m. 6:00 p.m. If you have any questions, please speak with Kelly Spanninger. - Monthly Reparations Offering Next Week, Sunday, June 1st, during Worship In Luke's Gospel, Jesus tells a story about a compassionate Samaritan, suggesting that God's people are called to work for healing and restoration for our neighbors, regardless of who or what caused them harm. In light of this, St. Andrew has made a commitment to reparations in regard to African American spiritual songs used in our worship. The text and music of most hymns is attributed to specific authors, with copyrights in place, usage reported, and royalties paid to those whose works are featured in worship. With African American spirituals, this is not possible. In response to many years of such uncredited use, St. Andrew invites the congregation to give a reparations offering. Funds received in worship will be donated to our siblings at Bethel AME Church, whose land and building were taken from them in the 1950s, to fund their development in the Hill District.
- Welcoming Congregations and Sanctuary What Does This Mean? Several years ago, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), of which St. Andrew is a member, started a new initiative called AMMPARO, based on the Spanish word for "refuge" or "protection." AMMPARO is an acronym for Accompanying Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy, Representation, and Opportunities. The initiative was a response to the great needs of unaccompanied minors who were coming to the U.S., and ELCA churches were invited to support the work. St. Andrew became an AMMPARO Welcoming Congregation, committing to accompany and minister to migrants, to pray for migrants, and to advocate for just public policy regarding immigration. In 2019, at the ELCA Churchwide Assembly, our church identified itself as a "Sanctuary Denomination," which prompted much discussion of how we interpret the word "sanctuary" (See local Bishop Kurt Kusserow's letter encouraging this discernment, "Sanctuary Church: Being our Best Selves," here:

- June Produce Distribution Tuesday, June 3rd, 5:30-7:00 p.m. St. Andrew partners with Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank to serve as a distribution site for fresh produce on the first Tuesday of every month. This month's distribution will be on Tuesday, June 3rd. We invite people of the congregation to help with the distribution from 5:30-7:00 p.m. and/or to help with unloading and setup during the day between 10:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.
- Bethel AME Church Juneteenth Celebrations Sunday, June 22nd, 11:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Friends at Bethel AME Church have invited St. Andrew to join in their events on Sunday, June 22nd in celebration of Juneteenth. Morning worship will be at 11:00 a.m., with Bishop Stafford J.N. Wicker, Presiding Bishop of the Third Episcopal District of the AME Church, preaching. A fellowship meal will follow the service. Afternoon worship will be at 2:00 p.m. with Bishop Kurt Kusserow of our Southwestern Pennsylvania Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, preaching. Musicians, choir members, and soloists are invited to help lead worship. Please contact Minister of Music Laura Reynolds at ministerofmusic@standrewpittsburgh.org if you would like to participate and she will coordinate with Minister Holt of Bethel.
